MESSAGE: "TEACHINGS" (review)

I. FOUNDATIONS:

A. JESUS' WORDS... **John 14:6 (NIV)**

Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

B. JESUS' WORDS... **John 6:40 (NIV)**

For my Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day."

II. REVIEW: LOST & FOUND

A. Lost Son **Luke 15:17-19 (NIV)**

17 "When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have food to spare, and here I am starving to death! 18 I will set out and go back to my father and say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. 19 I am no longer worthy to be called your son; make me like one of your hired servants.'

B. Son's Return **Luke 15:20-21 (NIV)**

20 So he got up and went to his father. "But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him. 21 "The son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.'

C. Feast **Luke 15:22-24 (NIV)**

22 "But the father said to his servants, 'Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. 23 Bring the fattened calf and kill it. Let's have a feast and celebrate. 24 For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' So they began to celebrate.

D. Be Glad **Luke 15:31-32 (NIV)**

31 "'My son,' the father said, 'you are always with me, and everything I have is yours. 32 But we had to celebrate and be glad, because this brother of yours was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' " "

E. Rejoicing **Luke 15:10 (NIV)**

10 In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

III. OUR MASTER

A. Worldly Wealth **Luke 16:10-11 (NLT)**

10 "If you are faithful in little things, you will be faithful in large ones. But if you are dishonest in little things, you won't be honest with greater responsibilities. 11 And if you are untrustworthy about worldly wealth, who will trust you with the true riches of heaven?"

B. Two Masters **Luke 16:12-13 (NLT)**

12 And if you are not faithful with other people's things, why should you be trusted with things of your own? 13 "No one can serve two masters. For you will hate one and love the other; you will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money."

C. Scoffing Luke 16:14-15 (NLT)

14 The Pharisees, who dearly loved their money, heard all this and scoffed at him. 15 Then he said to them, “You like to appear righteous in public, but God knows your hearts. What this world honors is detestable in the sight of God.

IV. LAW & PROPHETS

A. Until John Luke 16:16 (NLT)

16 “Until John the Baptist, the law of Moses and the messages of the prophets were your guides. But now the Good News of the Kingdom of God is preached, and everyone is eager to get in.

B. God’s Law Luke 16:17- 18 (NLT)

17 But that doesn’t mean that the law has lost its force. It is easier for heaven and earth to disappear than for the smallest point of God’s law to be overturned. 18 “For example, a man who divorces his wife and marries someone else commits adultery. And anyone who marries a woman divorced from her husband commits adultery.”

V. RICH MAN & LAZARUS

A. The Rich Man Luke 16:19 (NLT)

19 Jesus said, “There was a certain rich man who was splendidly clothed in purple and fine linen and who lived each day in luxury.

B. Poor Man Lazarus Luke 16:20-21 (NLT)

20 At his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus who was covered with sores. 21 As Lazarus lay there longing for scraps from the rich man’s table, the dogs would come and lick his open sores.

C. Death Luke 16:22-23 (NLT)

22 “Finally, the poor man died and was carried by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried, 23 and his soul went to the place of the dead. There, in torment, he saw Abraham in the far distance with Lazarus at his side.

D. Father Abraham Luke 16:24-25 (NLT)

24 “The rich man shouted, ‘Father Abraham, have some pity! Send Lazarus over here to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue. I am in anguish in these flames.’ 25 “But Abraham said to him, ‘Son, remember that during your lifetime you had everything you wanted, and Lazarus had nothing. So now he is here being comforted, and you are in anguish.

E. Chasm Luke 16:26 (NLT)

26 And besides, there is a great chasm separating us. No one can cross over to you from here, and no one can cross over to us from there.’

F. Warnings Luke 16:27-29 (NLT)

27 “Then the rich man said, ‘Please, Father Abraham, at least send him to my father’s home. 28 For I have five brothers, and I want him to warn them so they don’t end up in this place of torment.’ 29 “But Abraham said, ‘Moses and the prophets have warned them. Your brothers can read what they wrote.’

G. Return from Dead Luke 16:30-31 (NLT)

30 “The rich man replied, ‘No, Father Abraham! But if someone is sent to them from the dead, then they will repent of their sins and turn to God.’ 31 “But Abraham said, ‘If they won’t listen to Moses and the prophets, they won’t be persuaded even if someone rises from the dead.’”
